**Release #1:**

On Friday, July 10, 2009 officers from the Garden City Police Department responded to three separate shootings within Garden City. At approximately 9:00 p.m. officers responded to 2950 Prairie Avenue, Garden City, KS for a reported shots fired call. The investigation revealed someone fired a large caliber firearm into a Morton style building where Steven Miller (61-years-old, of 2950 Prairie Avenue, Garden City, KS) was inside the shop working. The round penetrated the metal sheeting and a 2x6 before landing inside the shop. Miller was not injured and there is no suspect information available.

Officers responded to 2914 Fleming Street at approximately 10:50 p.m. for reported shots fired call. The preliminary investigation revealed two white males in a white extended cab full-size Chevrolet pickup pulled into the parking lot where several people were. They asked for "Hugo" and were told nobody knew a person by that name. They then fired a round off in the parking lot and left. Witnesses were able to advise one of the white males had a goatee, mustache and long hair in the back. No one was injured.

At approximately 11:00 p.m. officers investigated a shooting near the off ramp at the US Hwy 83/50 Bypass and US Hwy 50. The victim, Antonio Solorzano (17-years-old, of 3015 Crane Road, Garden City, KS) was driving southbound on the Bypass when someone in a silver Dodge Neon with unknown Texas tags began following him. Someone from inside the Neon fired several shots at Solorzano's vehicle as the Neon exited the Bypass onto the off ramp. Solorzano was not injured and his vehicle was not hit. Officers were able to locate four 9mm shell casings at the scene.
