From 11:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 14, 2009 to 3:00 a.m. on Sunday, March 15, 2009 the Garden City Police Department conducted a DUI saturation patrol within the city limits of Garden City, KS.

The following arrests were made as a result of the saturation patrol:
